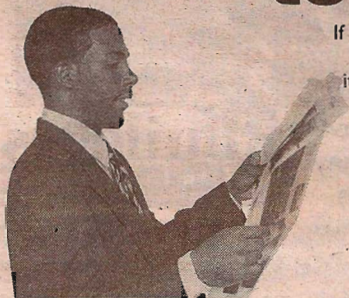
Two one-act dramas explore the lives of anti-slavery activist Harriet Tubman and author Harriet Beecher Stowe. In "Harriet Squared," Camilla Ross is abolitionist Tubman in "Harriet Tubman's Dream," which was written by Lisa Giordano; Emma Palzere-Rae portrays writer Stowe in "Aunt Hattie's House," a work Palzere-Rae also authored. Aaron Arbieter directs the production, which runs March 20-29 at Union Baptist Church in Mystic.
